Racing Areas & Division Assignments:

There will be three separate racing areas, one for each Division. The rendezvous locations and Division assignments are below.

Racing Area for Ocean Divisions:

- Division 1: Approximately 3.5 NM south of buoy G7 in Bar Cut
- Division 2: Approximately 1.5 NM south of buoy G7 in Bar Cut

Racing Area for the Biscayne Bay Division:

- Division 3: Approximately 1.5 NM southeast of Matheson Hammock

Division Assignments

Thursday (March 10)

- Division 1: Transpac 52, PHRF 1, Farr 40, PHRF 2, PHRF 3, PHRF 4

Friday – Sunday (March 11-13)

- Division 1: Transpac 52, PHRF 1, Farr 40, Mumm 30
- Division 2: PHRF 2, PHRF 3, J/105, PHRF 4
- Division 3: Melges 24, Etchells, PHRF 5, J/24

Emergency Procedures

Premiere Racing recommends that you use the following procedures in emergency situations while on the water.

For serious or life threatening situations:

1. Contact the Coast Guard on VHF Channel 16.
2. Identify your boat, the nature of the emergency (type of injury, number of people injured) and your boat's position.
3. After establishing contact with the Coast Guard, notify the Race Committee on your designated VHF channel as soon as practicable.

For non-life threatening situations:

1. Call 911, identify your boat, the nature of the emergency (type of injury, number of people injured) and your boat's position.
2. Proceed at best speed to the closest land location or rendezvous point as directed by emergency personnel.
3. Contact the Race Committee on your designated VHF channel as soon as practicable.

An AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) is available for emergency use on each racing circle as well as shoreside.

You are asked to cooperate fully with any Coast Guard and EMS direction. Please take time to review these procedures with your entire crew.

The Race Committee can be contacted at any point and will assist in whatever way possible.
